



## Complementary Screening of ‘Ask Not’ at Switch on Wednesday, July 29

The Human Rights Campaign, the nation’s largest lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender (LGBT) civil rights organization, in partnership with Servicemembers United, the nation's largest organization of gay and lesbian troops and veterans and their straight allies, will be bringing the Voices of Honor Tour to Trenton on Thursday, July 30th. The national tour highlights the discriminatory law that hurts military readiness and national security while putting American soldiers fighting overseas at risk.

To prepare for the Trenton event, Switch will be hosting an extended screening of the PBS film ‘Ask Not,’ a rare and compelling documentary film that explores the effects of the US military’s “don’t ask, don’t tell” policy on lesbian and gay soldiers and service members. Following the screening will be a Q & A session featuring documentary principles Alexander Nicholson and Jarrod Chlapowski, who also are veterans featured in the Voices of Honor Tour.
